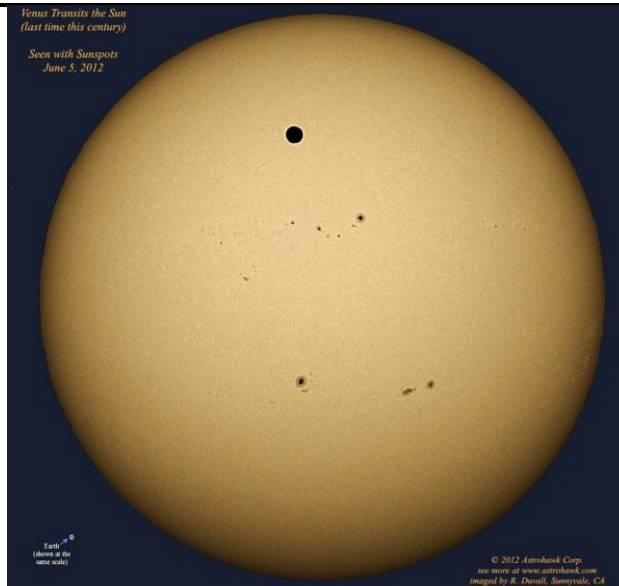

This has been a busy month for me. I've been working on advanced publicity for CW Open 2012. With the help of Atsu, JE1TRV, we created an invitation translated into Japanese and sent to over 300 avid contesters in Japan.

With the help of several others we compiled a list of EU contesters and sent out over 600 individual emails to them inviting them to CW Open 2012. I am now in the process of building the USA list and will be sending out invitations, this week, to those contesters, too.

The second running of CW Open promises to be a blockbuster event. We will not be competing with JA Keyman or RU, this year, so we should have a reasonably clear field. With the degree of advanced publicity, we should also have quite a bit of participation. So, if you did one or more sessions, last year, you can expect to have an even better level of activity in this one. And, if you missed last year's inaugural event, please consider taking part in this year's.

For those of you who are interested in snagging one of those gorgeous trophies, there are plenty of loggers to choose from (see www.cwops.org/cwopen.html) . For those of you who are interested in just fooling around, you don't have to log anything or submit anything, just get on and CQ or search & pounce, and give your serial number and first name. That's it. The more participants, the more fun it is for everyone!

Right now, CW Academy is on summer hiatus. The next regularly scheduled sessions are slated for 1 September through 31 October. But, there has been plenty of impromptu activity on those x.050-x.070 sub-bands. So, don't hesitate to get on and work these CW aspirants.

QTX is continuing to generate ragchew interest. At the end of 2012, we will award a trophy similar to the one's that you win in a CW Open session to the member who has amassed the most QTX points. We will continue that annual award from then on. So, don't forget to note those QSOs that go over 20 minutes, and don't forget to submit your QTX inputs at the end of each month (on the CWops members only Webpage).

CWT's are continuing to increase in popularity, and I suspect that after CW Open, there will be even more. If you've done one or more, you know how much fun those one-hour outings can be. If you haven't tried one yet, give it a shot. The exchange for members is first name and member number; for non-members it's first name and QTH abbreviation (e.g. CO, ON, FR, UK, RU, JA, NZ, etc.).

Here's the invitation that was sent to the JA contesters:

CWオープン2012

あなたを“CWオープン2012”に招待します。

「CWオープン」は従来にないスタイルのコンテストです。各セッション4時間のスプリント形式でトロフィー、盾、賞状などを得るチャンスがあります。3つの時間帯セッション制によりコンディションを選べるのでローパワーとワイヤーアンテナでも勝てるチャンスがあります。マルチはコールサインです。コールサインがマルチなので、地域に左右されません。ゾーン、カントリー、プリフィックスなどを気にすることなく兎に角できるだけ多くの局と“交信する”と高得点が得られるというコンテストです。

CWオープンは3つの時間帯セッションいずれに参加してもよく、各セッションの得点は個別に集計されます。各セッションの1位にはトロフィーが授与されます。ハイパワー、ローパワー、QRPのそれぞれのカテゴリーの1位には盾が授与されます。各ITU地域の勝者には賞状が授与されます。

各セッションは4時間。

- セッション1は2100JST-0100JST (2012/9/1-9/2)
- セッション2は0500JST-0900JST (2012/9/2)
- セッション3は1300JST-1700JST (2012/9/2)

次の1バンド以上で運用： 160, 80, 40, 20, 15,10m バンド

ナンバーは“シリアルナンバー”と“ハンドル”(たとえば“4 yoshi”)

得点は1バンドの1QSOを1ポイントとします。バンドを通じてユニークなコールサインの数がマルチになります。

例えば：

- 3つの異なるバンドで同じ局と交信すると、3ポイントと1マルチです。
- ひとつのバンドで異なる3局と交信すると、3ポイントと3マルチです。

1セッションだけでも2セッションあるいは3セッション全部でもエントリーは自由です。各セッションのスコアは総合スコアで授与される賞のために集計されます(総合優勝のトロフィー、ハイパワー/ローパワー/QRPの勝者への盾、ITU地域勝者への賞状)

)。

You Are Invited to the CW Open



The CW Open is 3 separate 4-hour CW contests.

- Sept 1: 1200-1559Z; Sept 1: 2000-2359Z; Sept 2: 0400-0759
- Participate in 1, 2 or all 3 sessions
- 160, 80, 40, 20, 15 and 10 meters – work 1 or more bands

Each session is scored separately

- Awards for each session
- Awards for combined session scores

Many contest logs support CW Open (see www.cwops.org/cwopen.html)

- Exchange is Serial Number and Given Name (e.g. 4 alex)
- Score is 1 point per call sign worked **once per band**
- Multiplier is 1 multiplier per call sign worked **once per session**
- Each session is logged separately and begins with 0 points and 0 multipliers

Awards

- Beautiful trophy for winner of each session
- Beautiful plaques for HP, LP and QRP winners of each session
- Beautiful trophy for winner of combined session scores
- Beautiful plaques for HP, LP and QRP winners of combined session scores

Categories

- HP=legal power above 100 watts
 - LP = 100 watts or less
 - QRP= 5 watts or less
 - Single ops
 - Teams of single ops (see www.cwops.org/cwopen.html)
 - Packet, Skimmer, and Reverse Beacon systems are allowed!

Academy



It is not uncommon for Ham Radio to take a back seat to picnics, family vacations, yard work and other outside activities during summer months but this is not the case with CW Academy. Plans for Group I, II and III student classes and "Elmering" in September are well underway. As mentioned in previous CW Academy articles, students are grouped in three categories - Group I, Beginners, Group II those with experience but needing assistance and Group III those who want something new but don't feel ready to take the plunge.

Based on success of the first interactive OOVOO Beginner Class that ended May, 31 the Academy decided to conduct an experimental forty-five day Group II class using OOVOO Internet conferencing with eleven volunteer students who had different levels of Morse Code experience and proficiency. Interactive thirty-minute classes started on June 4th with focus on helping students reach individual goals and overcome specific problems.

Goals and problems submitted by the students include:

Goals	Problems
Learn to copy CW bulletins	I'm stuck at 13 wpm
Qualify for Code Proficiency Awards	Can't increase my receiving and sending speed
Become a good CW operator	I need to improve my fist using paddles
Be able to have QSOs with others that enjoy	Can't send accurately with paddles and keyer

CW Increase receiving speed to 20	Can't stop counting dits and dahs when I try to copy
Increase receiving speed 25 - 30 wpm	Always confuse A, N, K, R
Learn how to copy bad fists	Can't copy incorrectly spaced characters
Learn how to improve my fist	Can't tell the difference between B, 6, H, 5
Be able to enjoy CW and not get lost	I don't do well with keyer & paddles over 10 wpm
Learn to do CW Contesting and use N1MM Logger	I get frustrated every time I make sending errors
Learn how to work DX using CW	I can only copy individual letters not words
Learn more about operating CW	I freeze up when I miss a character
Learn to copy in my head	I write down every letter, when I miss one, I get lost
Learn to copy when there is QRM, QRN and QSB	I loose focus on what is sent when I make mistakes
Be able to send accurately at 25 wpm	I don't have enough confidence to get on the air
Learn how to send with fewer errors	I just can't seem to learn to copy CW
Learn how to use Morse Code as a language	Trouble with numbers
Improve traffic net procedures skills to handle traffic	I don't have anyone to practice with
Learn proper use of Q Signals and Prosigns	I'm trying to improve my sending and receiving skills but not making much progress
I'm tired of SSB and Digital modes, want to do CW Qualify for Cwops Club membership	

Volunteer students were grouped in time slots based on their current level of proficiency, goals, problems and time zones. As of July 1, with two weeks remaining in the experimental project, results are quite encouraging:

- Two students decided to start over and asked to be scheduled for Group I class in September
- One student has already resolved several problems, reached his goals and is now active on CW

- One student participated in the June 27th CWT and says, "What fun, I'm hooked."
- Students who were copying at 10-12 wpm are now copying calls, words and short phrases at 20 wpm
- Students who were copying 15-18 wpm are now copying calls, contest exchanges and words at 25 wpm
- A student who was at 22 wpm is now copying calls, contest exchanges, words and phrases at 30 wpm
- All students are now copying in their heads, pencil and paper are a thing of the past except when logging
- Students have started using Morse Code as a language versus simply copying letters

Once again OOVOO video conferencing has proven to be a very effective tool for mentoring and teaching group Morse Code classes. Students and Advisors can also use OOVOO for one-on-one practice and students are using the applications as a tool for interactive practice versus going it alone or trying to get on the air when propagation is not favorable or if a private practice session is preferred. Best of all OOVOO is free...

Rob, K6RB continues to conduct three and four way round table QSO sessions for students and his roundtable activity is gaining popularity. Look for Rob and students plus or minus 3550, 7050 or 14050 and join the fun. Or, simply call CQ CWA or respond to CWA CQs to practice, seek advice from Advisors or simply have fun doing QSOs with other CWA students. One of the best ways to gain proficiency is to get on the air.

For those who want to get involved in contesting, state QSO Parties provide an excellent opportunity, the pace is not as hectic as major contests, speeds are usually slower and QSO parties are ten hour events. CW Academy students are also encouraged to take part in CWops Mini Tests which are held on the 2nd and 4th Wednesday's of each month. These one hour operating events provide an excellent opportunity to interact with club members and get your feet wet in contest type activities. Membership in CWops is not a requirement, simply use your first name and state, province or if you are DX, your prefix as your exchange. Examples:

N1XXX Larry CT or VE3XXX Jim ONT or DL1XXX Hans DL. Refer to <http://www.cwops.org/onair.html> for details.

Looking ahead to CW Academy Classes starting in September, there are currently eighteen students on the list for Group I. Beginner Classes which will be conducted by K6RB and WØUCE using OOVVOO. There is no shortage of Group II and III students who are also future candidates for club membership. Unfortunately student applications still out number Advisors so any member who is willing to devote a bit of spare time to share knowledge and experience in order to help others will be greatly appreciated.

Despite the shortage of Advisors, CW Academy has thus far paired some seventy students with volunteer Advisors and Jay continues to work feverously to pair students with Advisors. Thus far seventy-two students have or continue to receive help with learning and improving their Morse Code proficiency.
