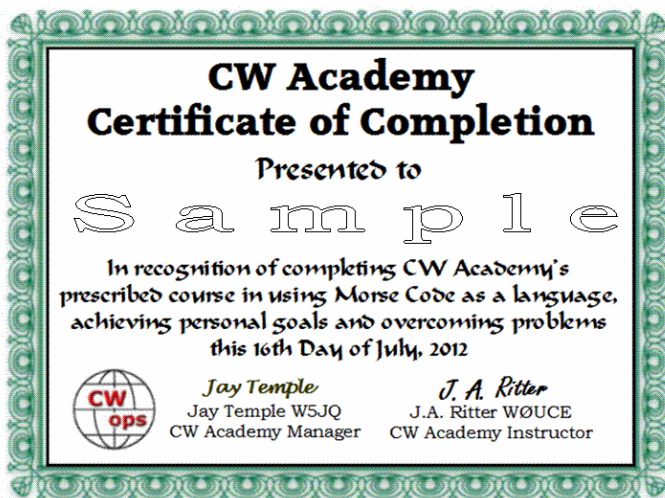
CW Academy

The first ever CW Academy online interactive Group II class ended on July 16. Sincere congratulations are extend to K6HTN, KA8HDE, N1TF, N4DSP, N9VKU, W4JBB and W5JCS who achieved their personal Morse Code proficiency enhancement goals, overcame receiving and sending problems and were presented certificates of completion in recognition of their achievements. One student has already qualified, been nominated and accepted for membership in CWops. Several students operated CW during Field Day before the class ended and are now participating in CWT Mini-tests and other CW Contests.

Once again the value of using OOVOO interactive video and audio conferencing as the communications media for CW Academy training classes has proven successful.

Other than an occasional loss of connection during peak activity hours which is the OOVOO equivalent of QSB, students received and sent Morse in real time using webcams and computer soundcard audio.

Students and the instructor keyed transceiver side tone during teaching and practice sessions to engage in Morse Code QSOs, simulated DX pileups, Field Day and CWT contests.



A number of students continue to get together using OOVOO several times a week to further their Morse Code proficiency through interactive online practice and rag chewing sessions.

It is rewarding to see students who may never have otherwise met on the air become and continue to be friends.
